
Joint programmes at KU Leuven



European Approach for Quality Assurance of Joint Programmes (2021) via **NVAO** + national procedures






















European Approach








Flanders

- NVAO recognises the European Approach
- Institutional accreditation but programme accreditation needed for new programmes
- The European Approach is mandatory for all joint programmes (legislation)

Partner Universities

- Some partners institutional accreditation, some programme accreditation needed
- Some countries: no recognition of European Approach; national procedures required
- All partners acknowledged the added value of the European Approach and were motivated to use it as a first step in the quality assurance of the new programme

Challenges

Restrictive national legislation regarding

- the implementation of the European approach and mutual recognition (national accreditation procedures that do not recognise the European Approach decision).
- the possibility to create an interdisciplinary programme/degree, or degrees in specific fields
- curriculum aspects (minimum or maximum ECTS credits per course; minimum ECTS credits for truncus communis; determining a maximum number of evaluations for a programme, etc.)
- tuition fees (high fees/low fees/free)
- the possibility of selection of students (on capacity of students and/or quantitative restrictions) in a bachelor and/or master







Challenges

Restrictive national legislation regarding

- the use of foreign languages in a degree Programme (bachelor or master)
- study length of the Programme of a bachelor or master
- the possibility to create an interdisciplinary degree, or degrees in specific fields
- mobility options (or lack of legislation to facilitate this, except for Erasmus programmes)
- the form of the degree

Opportunities

As a joint framework, the European Approach is a great tool for going through a joint external quality assessment together with partner universities of countries where the Approach is recognized.
