- 1. prepare and publish a national implementation plan reflecting national priorities related to the Bologna Process (BP) reforms and tools and to ensure greater and consistent engagement of higher education stakeholders with the BFUG working structures and activities,
- 2. set up national Bologna expert teams and consider establishing national Bologna hubs,
- 3. allocate adequate, sustainable resources and funding dedicated to knowledge sharing,
- 4. set up a Coordination Group within the BFUG.



#### **Recommendations:**

- 1. prepare and publish a national implementation plan reflecting national priorities related to the Bologna Process (BP) reforms and tools and ensure greater and consistent engagement of higher education stakeholders with the BFUG working structures and activities
  - Organise information sessions about the main messages of the Ministerial Communiqué.
  - Organise parallel sessions in the BFUG meetings with practitioners to discuss thematic issues in depth.
  - Create more space for peer-learning activities in the work models of the BFUG working structures.
  - Organise labelled Bologna events or seminars to facilitate exchange between BFUG and the HE sector.
  - Create easy-to-read materials explaining the history of the BP, what it is about and what it strives for and create materials containing core information about the BP, the BFUG working structures, the decision-making process and explanation of the relevant acronyms.

#### **Recommendations:**

- 1. prepare and publish a national implementation plan reflecting national priorities related to the Bologna Process (BP) reforms and tools and ensure greater and consistent engagement of higher education stakeholders with the BFUG working structures and activities
  - Consider establishing a dedicated body or unit at the ministry or mandate an existing organisation to lead the
    development of the national implementation plan, coordinate and organise activities related to BP and
    ensure continuous dissemination of information.
  - Facilitate **consultations** and organise meetings with the **HE stakeholders** to set the national priorities and involve them in the drafting of the national implementation plan.
  - Organise regular and ad hoc meetings, events and consultations with all the HE stakeholders, including practitioners, thus creating space for more profound and meaningful discussions.
  - Develop a National Bologna Process Implementation Report, including relevant data gathered by the HE stakeholders.
  - Translate the Ministerial Communiqués, to improve the understanding of commitments.

#### **Recommendations:**

- 2. set up national Bologna expert teams and consider establishing national Bologna hubs
  - The experts should demonstrate **sound knowledge and experience** of the higher education system in their **country**, good **knowledge and understanding of the Bologna process**, the objectives and values of the EHEA and best practice in **applying** the approved instruments (Bologna tools).
  - Objectives: to spread knowledge and understanding of the EHEA objectives and tools; to assist, monitor, enhance, meaningful implementation of the EHEA objectives; to liaise with and support Ministries and other stakeholders; to train trainers in HEIs to be a Bologna oriented institutional resource and receive information from the proposed BFUG Coordination group; to provide mentoring support; to promote best practice; to engage in peer-to-peer learning; to participate in the international and thematic networks.
  - Bologna Hubs: **framework** including students, academics, researchers, HEI management and administrative staff, national authorities, Bologna expert teams and HEREs.
  - **Activities** of such hubs: **share** information, **debate** the objectives of the BP, the implementation of its key commitments at the national and HEIs levels, determine common actions and **propose** recommendations.

#### **Recommendations:**

- 4. Set up a Coordination Group within the BFUG
  - to further develop resources and tools adapted to an evolving BP,
  - to assemble a team specialised in creating content about the BP and its work audio, video and text,
  - to support and coordinate the national Bologna expert teams and hubs and national and EHEA level initiatives and to act as an international platform for peer exchange for the national Bologna experts.



# Contribution for the Tirana Communiqué



Ministers recognise the need for more effective collaboration between the policy level and the higher education community.

Consultations regarding perceptions of the Bologna process highlighted that enhanced dissemination of knowledge and strengthened dialogue about ongoing work and new perspectives developed by the BFUG and its working groups should be achieved. Communication and dissemination tools relevant for each context should be used more systematically to enhance knowledge sharing within our countries and across national borders. We commit to embedding these tools and extending their use in the coming work period.

We indicate as a priority for all EHEA countries the development of national action plans to put into practice the EHEA reforms and tools. These should include organising and supporting national and international networks of well-informed experts who are able to share knowledge about the Bologna Process, support the implementation of higher education policies and reforms and cooperate across national borders and with the BFUG.
