HOW DOES IT WORK?

The Bologna Follow-Up Group (BFUG), composed of 49 countries and the European Commission, drives the Bologna Process. To join the EHEA, nations commit to aligning their higher education systems with Bologna's objectives.

WHAT'S THE BOLOGNA PROCESS?

Its mission: harmonize higher education across Europe. The EHEA promotes three-cycle education, mutual recognition of qualifications, and quality assurance, fostering collaboration among universities.

Breaking Barriers:

Promoting Gender Equality in Higher Education



DID YOU KNOW that while women make up 42.3% of academic staff, only 23.6% of higher education institution rectors are women? At the heart of the European Trade Union Committee for Education's discussions lies the pursuit of gender equality and career development for higher education teachers and researchers. Addressing these issues head-on, trade union representatives highlighted the challenges faced by academics and researchers, including heavy

Moreover, gender disparities persist in academia across Europe, with the SHE Figures Study 2021 revealing women's under-representation at the highest academic levels and decision-making positions. These gender gaps extend to technical professions and research funding access. However, positive strides, like Ireland's Gender Equality Taskforce Action Plan, showcase the potential for change through government-led initiatives. In this pursuit of equity, it's clear that robust

workloads, precarious contracts, and constant funding struggles. This is exemplified by a survey from Norway, where just one in five post-docs would recommend a research career to young people.


A Personal Journey into the Bologna Process and EHEA

Promoting Gender Equality in Higher Education

The European Higher Education Area (EHEA) is on a mission to demystify higher education through clear and verifiable learning outcomes. In today's educational landscape, these outcomes serve as essential tools for curriculum flexibility, student motivation, and the internationalization of academic programs. Thanks to EHEA implementation projects, the OeAD — Austria's Agency for Internationalization and Education has been leading the charge in exploring the synergy between learning outcomes, curriculum flexibility, and internationalization.


In a series of workshops, over 110 participants had the opportunity to test sample modules and witness how learning outcomes can seamlessly integrate into curricula to promote internationalization. A pivotal player in this initiative is the LOUIS concept, a toolbox for transversal learning outcomes developed within the European Higher Education Alliance AURORA. Additionally, an international peer learning activity within the Erasmus+ KA3 policy project brought together 52 representatives from 20 countries to discuss the practical implementation of learning outcomes in higher education institutions. Renowned expert Declan Kennedy emphasized the connection between learning outcome formulation, objectives, descriptors, qualification frameworks, ECTS credits, and quality assurance, highlighting the importance of collaborative teaching and students' appreciation for the transparency that learning outcomes bring to their educational journey.

Chair Rob Copeland underscored HERSC's commitment to amplifying the voices of staff within the European Higher Education Area (EHEA) and emphasized the crucial role of equity, inclusion, and diversity among higher education staff to align with the Social Dimension objectives.

Annette Dolan (EI-ETUCE) outlined the ongoing work of the WG in developing a comprehensive EHEA framework for the Social Dimension of higher education. This framework aims to empower public authorities and higher education institutions in European member states to enhance the Social Dimension of higher education by implementing inclusive strategies. These strategies will offer vital support to vulnerable, disadvantaged, and underrepresented students, while benefiting the broader student population and staff. The discussion delved into the challenges faced by academic staff, gender equality concerns, and the importance of diversity. With surveys, webinars, and focus groups, this collaborative effort is poised to pave the way for a more inclusive and equitable higher education landscape.
