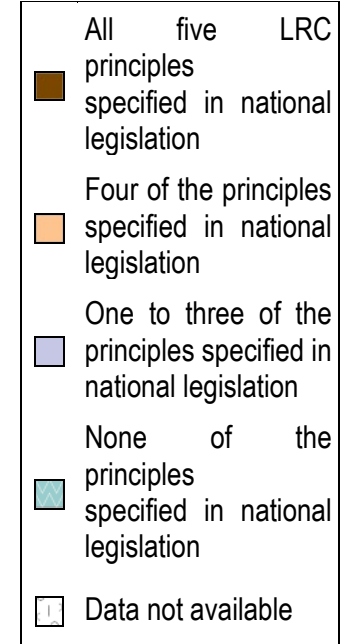
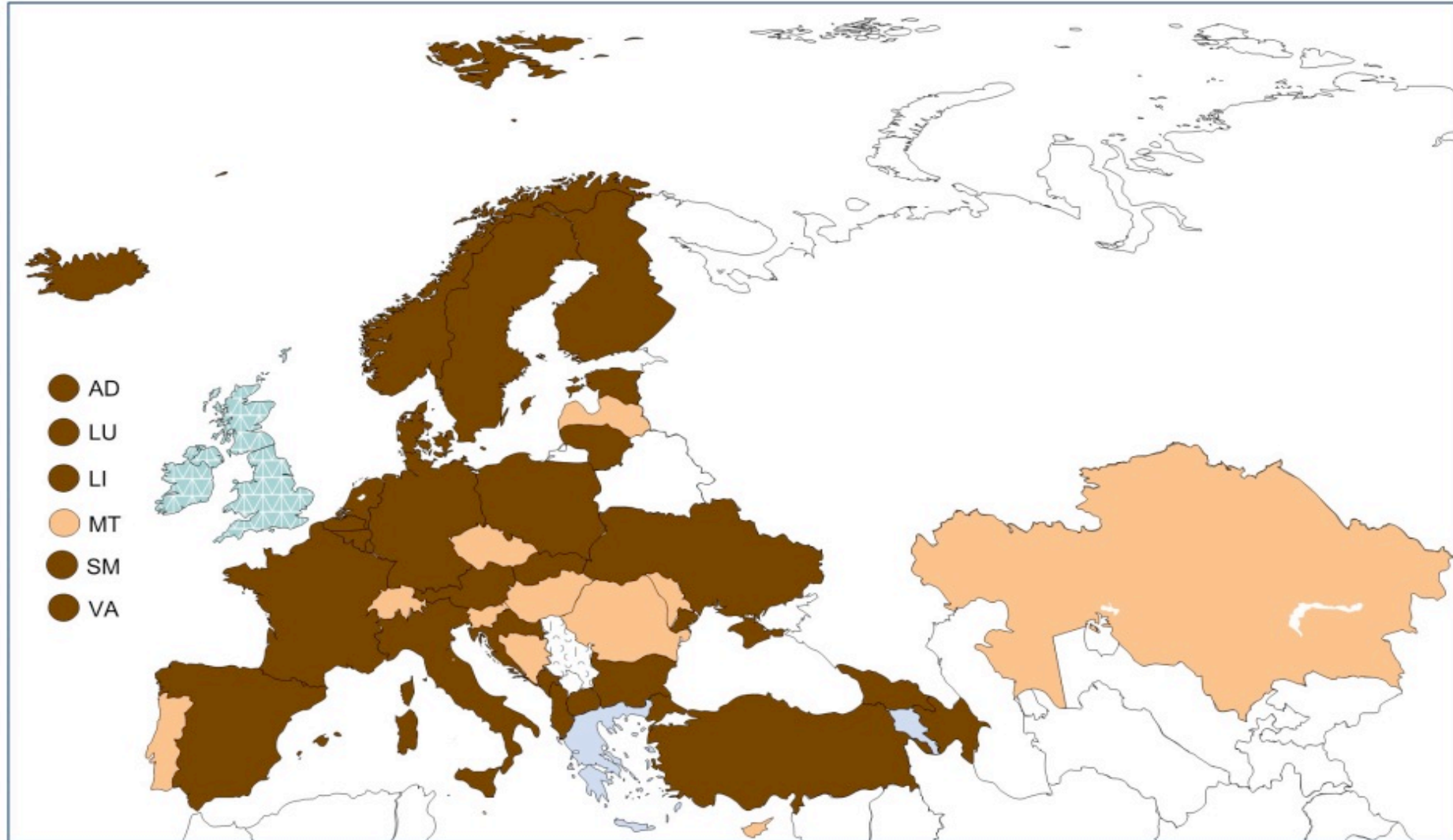

# Key Commitments: LRC Recognition:

Focus on legal implementation of 5 principles

- right to fair assessment;
- recognition if no substantial differences can be proven;
- comparing learning outcomes not programme contents;
- demonstration of substantial difference in cases of negative decision;
- applicant's right to appeal.

# LRC principles in national legislation

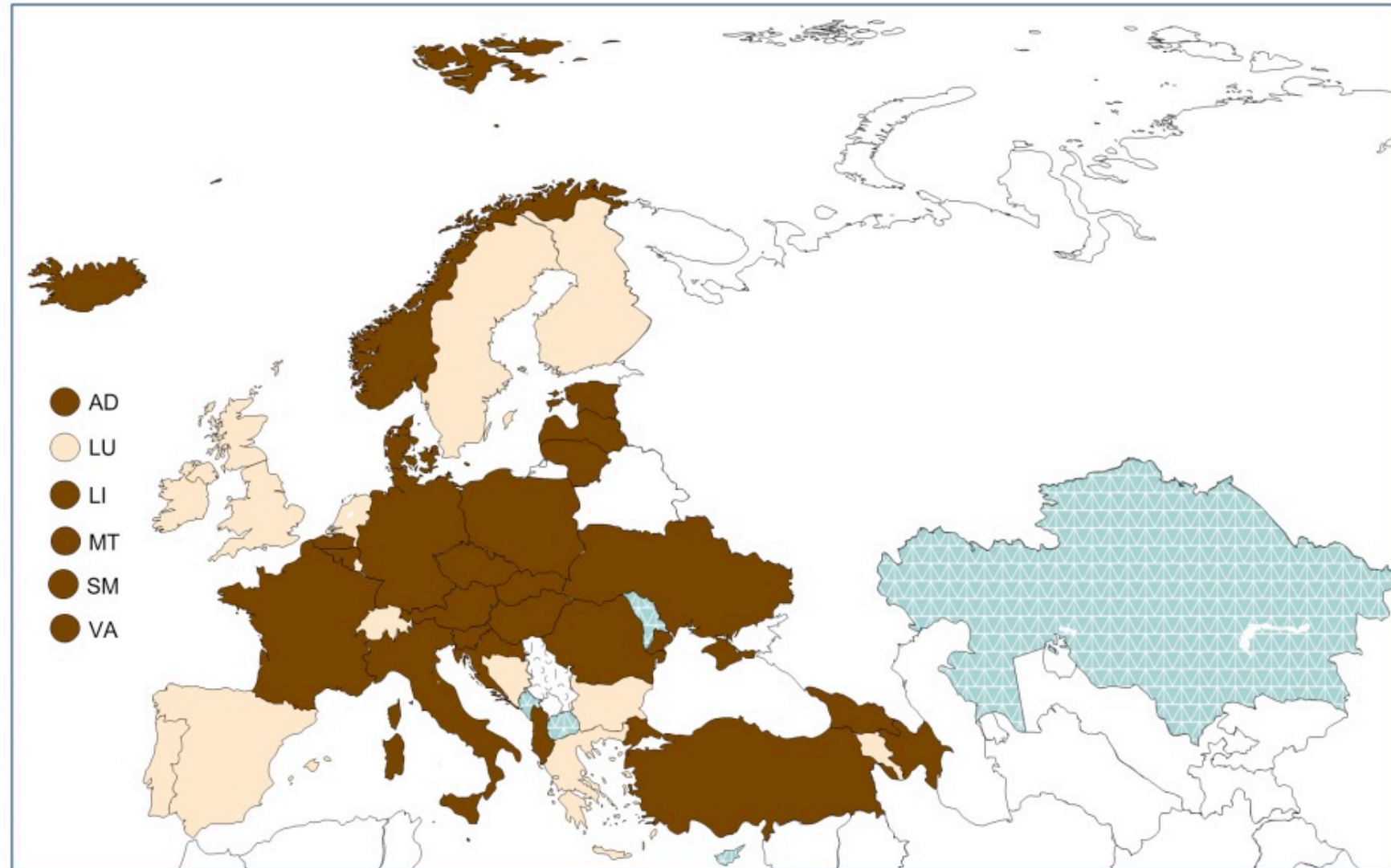


# Comparison with 2020 report

Increasing implementation: 8 more countries now implement all principles

Albania, Andorra, Austria, Croatia, Poland, Spain, Sweden and Ukraine

# Article VII implementation developments

- 29 systems have legal requirements for special recognition procedures for refugees, displaced persons and persons in a refugee-like situation
- Improvements in 7 countries
- Albania, Andorra, Austria, Azerbaijan, Croatia, Latvia, and Portugal

# Overall assessment

- Main principles: implementation improving
- Article VII: implementation improving
- Automatic Recognition also advancing: 19 countries now operate system-level automatic recognition, compared to 10 in the 2020 report
- Difficult to be certain about all the drivers of improvement, but impact of TPG work has clearly been positive..
