Priorities to pursue in the next period

What priorities should we pursue in the next decade?

The 6 following topics have been identified by the WG 2015-18 on new Goals

- Promoting active and responsible citizens;
- Linking EHEA and ERA;
- Using digital technologies;
- Supporting students from non-traditional backgrounds;
- Enhancing teacher support;
- Improving professional recognition

You may propose other topics as well.







PRIORITIES POST 20202/2

In order of priorities: the **5 first prirorities were all seen as important**; only «professional recongnition» seemd to have less support.

Other priorities mentionned more than once:

- Implementation of the 3 key commitments
- Fundamental/core values
- Innovation in Learning and Teaching
- Ensure coherence with the European Education Area
- Mobility







OTHER PROPOSED TOPICS 1/2

- Implementation of key commitments looking beyond system level at institutional level
- Implementation of the 3 BFUG key commitments
- Results of peer groups taken in the implementation report
- Strengthening of core values like academic freedom, institutional autonomy, student and staff representation
- Thematic sessions on academic freedom
- Talent development
- Following students during their career in HE and at the moment of graduation
- Flexible learning pathways
- Promotion of competence-oriented learning
- Promoting the continuous development of students-centred and innovative learning
- Assuring an efficient interlink between Bologna Process and EHEA
- Research reinforcement by workshops and meetings between EHEA and ERA







OTHER PROPOSED TOPICS 2/2

- Rethinking links between education and research
- Supporting international dual-degree programs
- Promotion of mobility
- Internationalisation of HE
- Qualifications frameworks
- Life-long learning
- Automatic recognition
- More active role of teachers in HE
- Funding
- Substantial core **public investment** in HE and research
- Real involvement of business community in HE







QUANTITATIVE GOALS FOR 2030 1/2

- There is some scepticism towards quantitative goals.
- Proposal to have rather **qualitative targets and implementation goals**. Tricky to set those quantitative goals.
- **Reaffirming mobility target** and complementarity with European Commission goals.
- Discussion should be done within the WG







QUANTITATIVE GOALS FOR 2030 2/2

Other comments:

- Monitoring of the implementation of all targets
- Understanding obstacles
- Results of AGs on Social Dimension as well as on L&T
- Defining more tangible indicators
- Coordination with what has been discussed at EU level
- Defining an incoming mobility benchmark
- Amount of countries with a functional National Access Plan
- Granting students' access to innovative learning methods
- Full implementation of the European Charter and Code for Researchers
- Reaffirming mobility targets








SHOULD THE WORKING METHODS BE MODIFIED?

- More evidence-based policy making style
- Simplified and less bureaucratic structure
- Efficiency, transparency and democratic methods
- Active involvement of stakeholders in the drafting of documents and more interaction between them
- A more durable arrangement
- Revival of «Bologna seminars» open to academic communities
- **Description of the working structures** within the EHEA website
- **Designated online areas** for working and advisory groups

CONCRETE PROPOSALS ON HOW TO OPTIMIZE THE EHEA GOVERNANCE WITH RESPECT TO THE BFUG BOARD

- In general satisfied with the Board: <u>66% of countries/consultative members had no</u> <u>proposals</u> (good way to involve the co-chairs)
- Smaller BOARD to ensure efficient discussions
- To facilitate handovers → the incoming vice-chairing should always participate in the last Board before a Ministerial Conference and the outgoing vice-chairing should participate in the first Board after a Ministerial Conference
- A more active role in the content-related issues and a more transparent work
- Better Board-Secretariat communication before the meetings and Board's minutes made available prior to the BFUG meetings
- Combination of functions and tasks of Board and Secretariat
- Inclusion of ETUCE/EI members as representatives of teachers/professors/researchers
- In specific topics/issues the Board could have decision making power







CONCRETE PROPOSALS ON HOW TO OPTIMIZE THE EHEA GOVERNANCE WITH RESPECT TO THE BFUG SECRETARIAT

- In general satisfied with the Secretariat: 61% of countries/consultative members had no proposals
- Establishment of an international, professional and permanent Secretariat, financed by Member States, or a core staff for at least two periods in order to ensure smooth implementation of tasks
- A more neutral, rather than country-centred view for the host country/vice-chair representative
- Involvement of different countries/nationalities
- It would be of interest to **analyse the issues involved in establishing EQAR** and its Secretariat as an NGO operating as a task force
- Cost-sharing among members
- More active role in information-sharing and up-to-date communication about the EHEA







CONCRETE PROPOSALS ON HOW TO OPTIMIZE THE EHEA GOVERNANCE WITH RESPECT TO THE BFUG

- Quite many proposals for improvement: <u>58% of countries/consultative members had no proposals</u>
- Discussion and information-sharing between various groups/stakeholders
- The BFUG must remain the **decision maker** before any proposal to the EHEA Ministers
- BFUG work programmes should **immediately** start following the Ministerial conference
- Full and durable involvement of decision-makers
- Focus on **content-related** rather than on procedural issues
- Clear decisions and clearly summarized actions at the end of each meeting
- Encouragement of less active members in the process
- Mandate **to take positions and decisions on behalf of one's ministry**, stressing the relationship between BFUG delegations and the political leadership of their Ministries/organizations
- Equal treatment among all stakeholders, Member States and various organisations







CONCRETE PROPOSALS ON HOW TO OPTIMIZE THE EHEA GOVERNANCE WITH RESPECT TO THE CHAIRING ARRANGEMENT

- In general very satisfied with the chairing arrangement: <u>77% of countries/consultative</u> <u>members had no proposals.</u> A lot of support for this format (valuable, really good, optimal, etc .)
- Chairs attendance at the BFUG as a pre-requisite to act as Co-Chair
- Vice-chairs are perhaps not needed
- Power-concentrating role of the vice-chairing
- Longer mandate of Chairs, for the sake of continuity
- A **permanent third membership** instead of the vice-chair, not open for representatives from countries co-chairing during the same period or organizing the EHEA conference in the same period







CONCRETE PROPOSALS ON HOW TO OPTIMIZE THE EHEA GOVERNANCE WITH RESPECT TO THE BOLOGNA POLICY FORUM


- <u>77% of countries/consultative members had no proposals</u>
- Doubtful outcomes: too narrow or too large selection of countries
- A follow-up with ongoing political dialogue and increased cooperation between EHEA and non-EHEA
- Lack of resources and of a permanent Secretariat following up the actions proposed makes it hard to achieve tangible results
- Platform for equal and respectful exchange on higher education challenges between global macroregions
- Involvement of professors and researchers representatives to the BPF
- Declaration of BPF goals
- Involvement of representatives from EHEA Ministries of Education and Foreign Affairs, as well as Embassies, in preparing BPF
- Earlier selection of BPF themes, identifying issues of clear interest to both EHEA and non-EHEA Ministries







HOW OFTEN SHOULD THE MINISTERIAL CONFERENCE BE HELD?



SUGGESTIONS ON HOW TO CONNECT MORE FRUITFULLY WITH HIGHER EDUCATION PRACTITIONERS

- EUA, EI, ETUCE and EURASHE might play an important role
- Re-invigoration of the Bologna Promoters/Experts Bologna Expert teams in each country, as a means to involve higher education practitioners
- Active involvement of higher education researchers in the discussion
- Working sessions for BFUG Members, as well as HEI conferences, workshops for experience sharing
- Exchange of best practices, remove existing barriers in educational procedures
- Thematic groups largely attended by practitioners who could come up with recommendations
- Close work with organizations representing different HE stakeholders
- Newsletter to all relevant stakeholders
- Member States could appoint education practitioners in different groups

<u>9% of countries/consultative members had no proposals</u>








MORE "BOLOGNA EVENTS" BETWEEN THE MINISTERIAL CONFERENCES?

- Good idea for visibility and understanding of the Bologna Process
- Bilateral and multilateral peer learning activities, especially with relevant stakeholders → added value
- Ensuring that they are quality events
- Regular hearings of Ministries on the progression of the Bologna reforms
- A yearly Bologna event in each member country
- "In order to trust you need to understand, and in order to understand you need to discuss. Bologna events are good opportunities for such discussions"
- Clear guidelines/criteria on which the event can be considered a «Bologna event»









SUGGESTION ON HOW TO FORMALLY INCLUDE OTHER STAKEHOLDERS IN THE BOLOGNA PROCESS

- Events targeted at the national/regional level
- Networking and newsletters
- Representation of employers to a greater extent
- Establishment of a category of Associate Membership of no more than 10 members
- Invitation of certain stakeholders as "advisory members" in specific BFUG WGs
- **Diversity** of profiles for the experts
- Kazakhstan as a Central Asian hub to disseminate successful experience in the region
- Regular involvement of a representative of the ENIC-NARIC network, given the importance of recognition issues
- Establishment of 2 additional seats for university networks and students organizations
- Publishing of an **open call** to ensure participation of other relevant organizations







ADDITIONAL IDEAS FOR THEMATIC AND PROCEDURAL INNOVATIONS AFTER 2020

- Focus on **communication strategy** of the entire Bologna Process
- Equal opportunities for refugees/applicants for asylum concerning their access to HE
- Promotion of regional cooperation: inter-Balkan, Mediterranean
- Establishment of a competition between Member States on the Bologna reforms implementation, awarding the successful ones
- Introduction of issues of **recognition of non-formal education** learning outcomes
- Concrete interaction between EHEA members/partners and Universities
- Development of students' entrepreneurship programmes at the European level
- Greater attention to Art and Philosophy areas
- Greater focus on the most relevant issues
