

EHEA framework cycles



The criteria and procedures

for verifying NQFs compatibility with the EHEA framework

- The **competent national bodies shall certify the compatibility** of the national framework with the European framework
- The self-certification process shall include the **stated agreement of the quality assurance bodies** in the country in question recognised through the Bologna Process
- The self-certification process shall involve **international experts**

Criteria and procedures continued

- The **self-certification and the evidence** supporting it shall be **published and shall address separately each of the criteria** set out
- The **ENIC and NARIC networks** shall **maintain a public listing of States that have confirmed that they have completed the self-certification process**
- The completion of the **self-certification process shall be noted on Diploma Supplements** issued subsequently by showing the link between the national framework and the European framework

Notes about the criteria and procedures

- The EHEA alignment criteria are interlinked and overlapping
- Also similar to the EQF referencing criteria, and this is why many countries have prepared combined referencing and self-certification reports
- Alignment with the EHEA framework is a process that is separate from developing the NQF

State of play and activities for the Peer Support Group

- Currently 24 countries have published their self-certification reports in the ENIC-NARIC portal and on the EHEA website
 - Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Macedonia, Malta, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Ukraine, and the United Kingdom
- How to support other countries to complete their self-certification?
- Support for other stages: national adoption and implementation of the NQF?
- How do we use self-certification reports on European level?

Concluding remarks/important topics linked to the self-certification

- Learning outcomes of individual qualifications vs. level descriptors in the QF
- System level mechanisms to support interaction between QF and quality assurance: good practice codes, guidelines for specification of learning outcomes/curriculum design, accreditation/ validation of programs
- Mobility and progression (national, international, recognition)
- Stakeholder involvement and commitment
- Documentation
