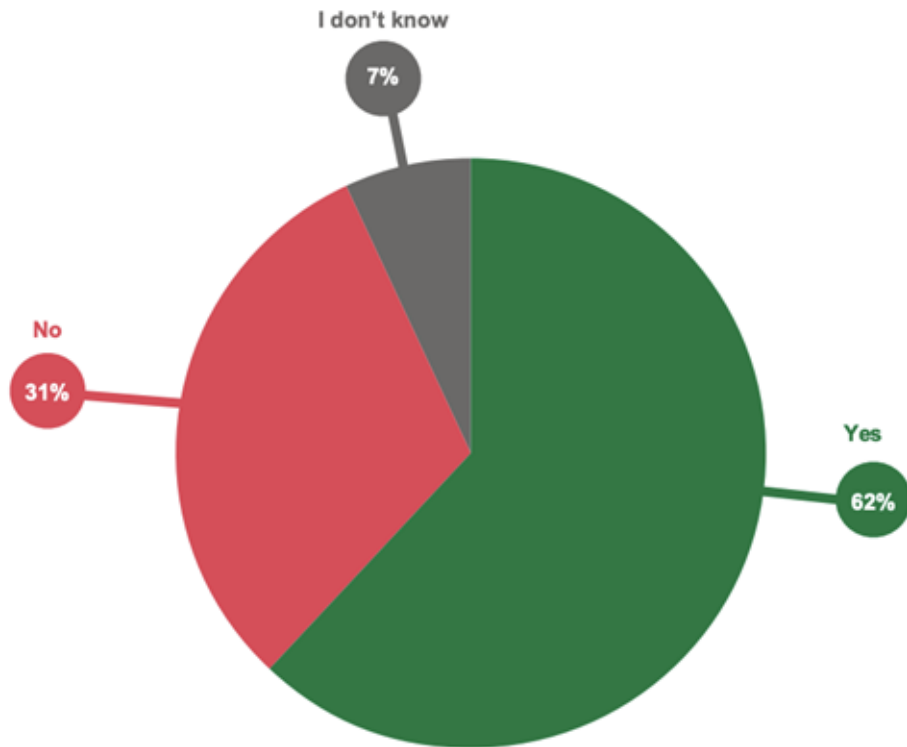

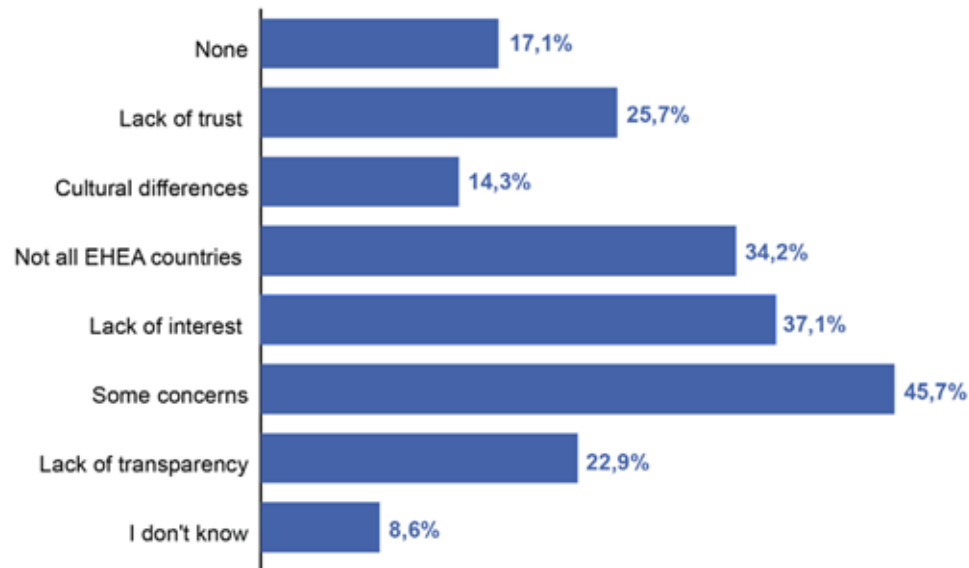
Students position on automatic recognition

- **Automatic recognition should be an enforceable right of students.**
- **It is beyond comprehension that after 27 years of the Bologna Process, the basic minimum trust and knowledge-sharing necessary to achieve automatic recognition are not met.**

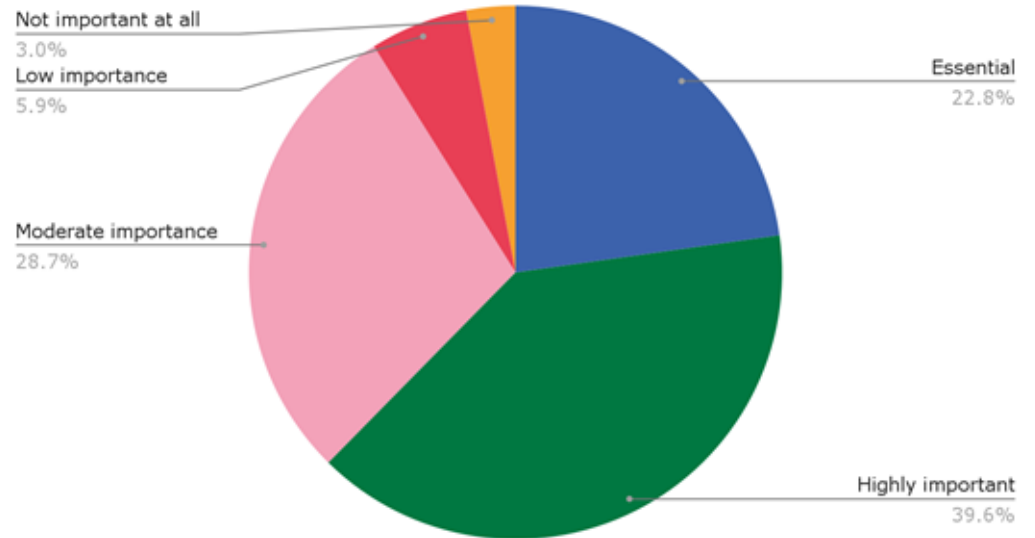
Implementation of automatic recognition of degrees from other EHEA countries

Key takeaways

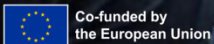
- The key commitments are built upon and rely upon each other, and as such a lack of full application of one can create an improper application of other components in the structure.
- At higher education institution level instances of not using automatic recognition are observed.

Recommendations based on BWSE 2024

- Ensure user-friendly recognition procedures;
- Support HEIs in their work on recognition;
- Promote the use of the European Qualifications' Passport for Refugees and availability of learning paths for refugee students.
- Promote timely recognition and valorisation of ECTS in learning mobility, both within Erasmus as well as other mobility programmes
