

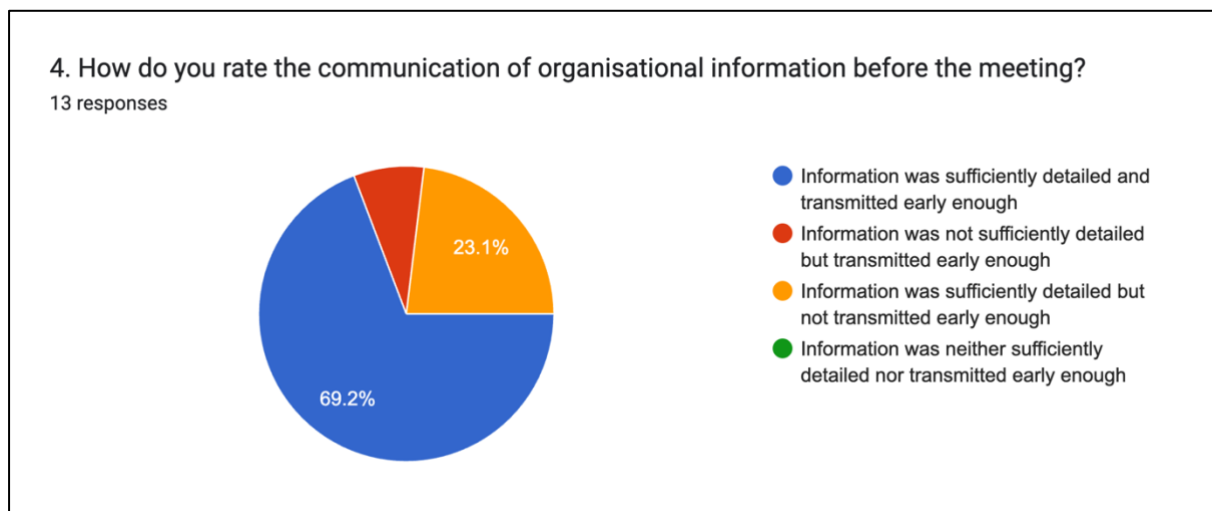
Feedback report

2nd WG on Fundamental Values meeting, 16th - 17th June 2025

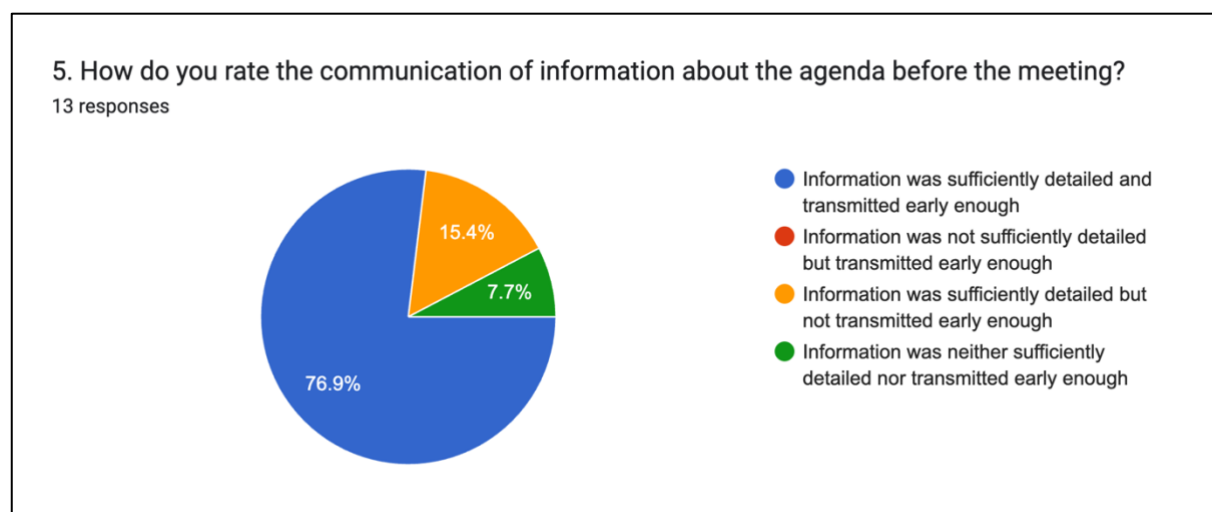
Hamrun (Malta)

1. Communication of organisational information before the meeting



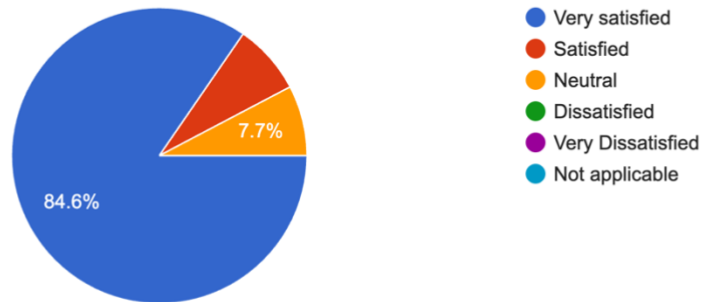
2. Communication of information about the agenda before the meeting

6. If the case, how satisfied were you with the support provided by the EHEA Secretariat, before and during the meeting?

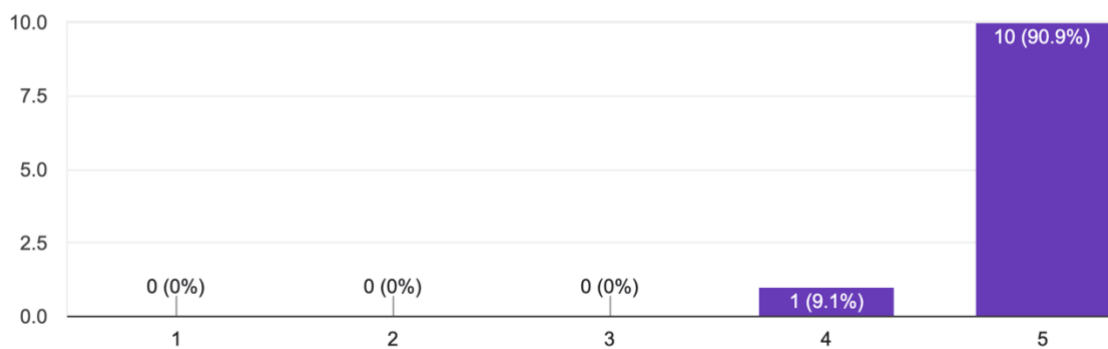

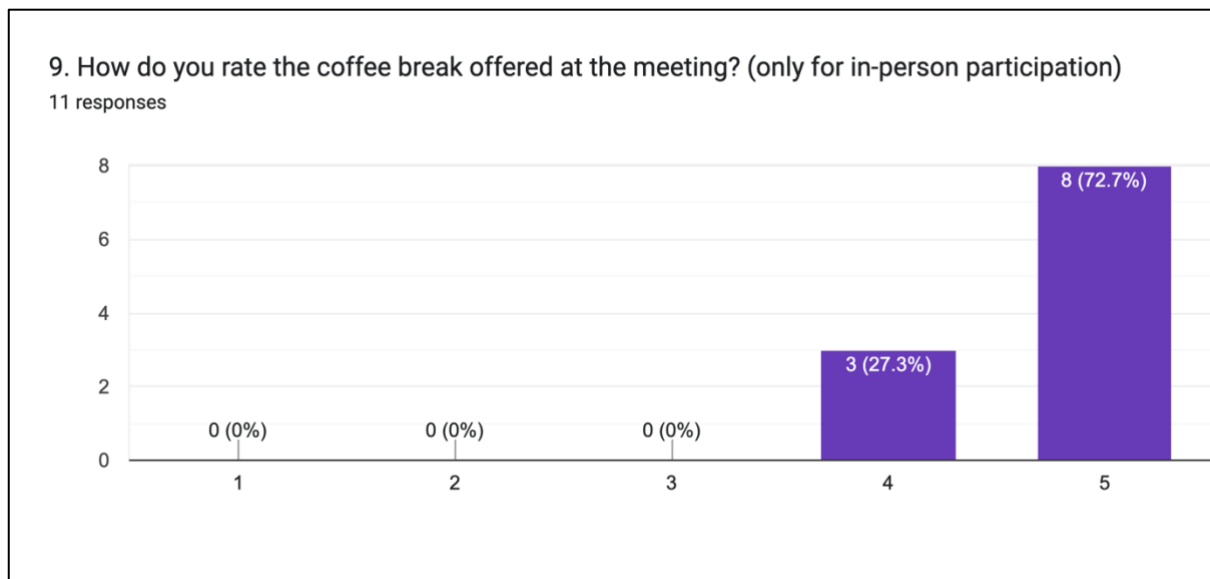
4. Meeting venue and facilities - 4.9 / 5

8. How do you rate the meeting venue and its facilities? (only for in-person participation)

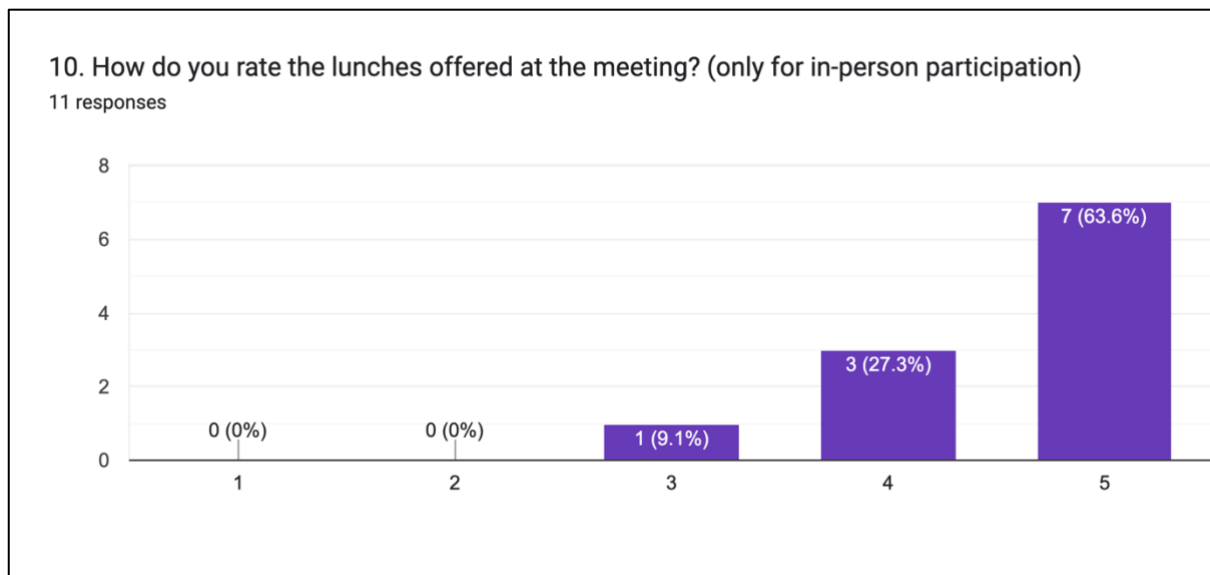

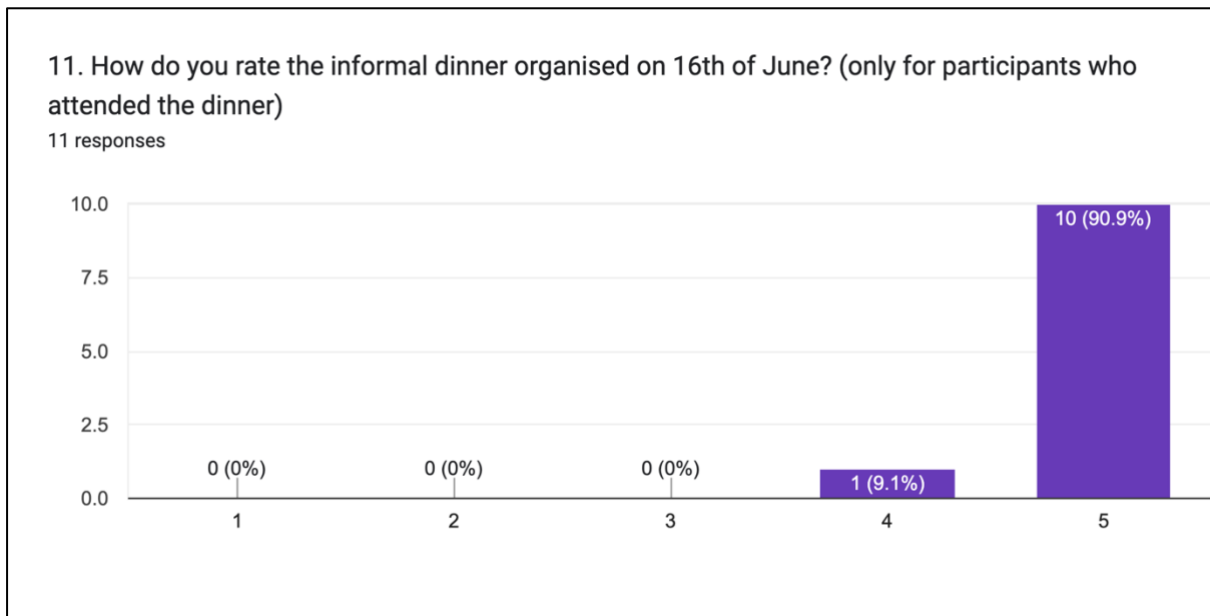
5. Coffee break offered at the meeting – 4.72 / 5



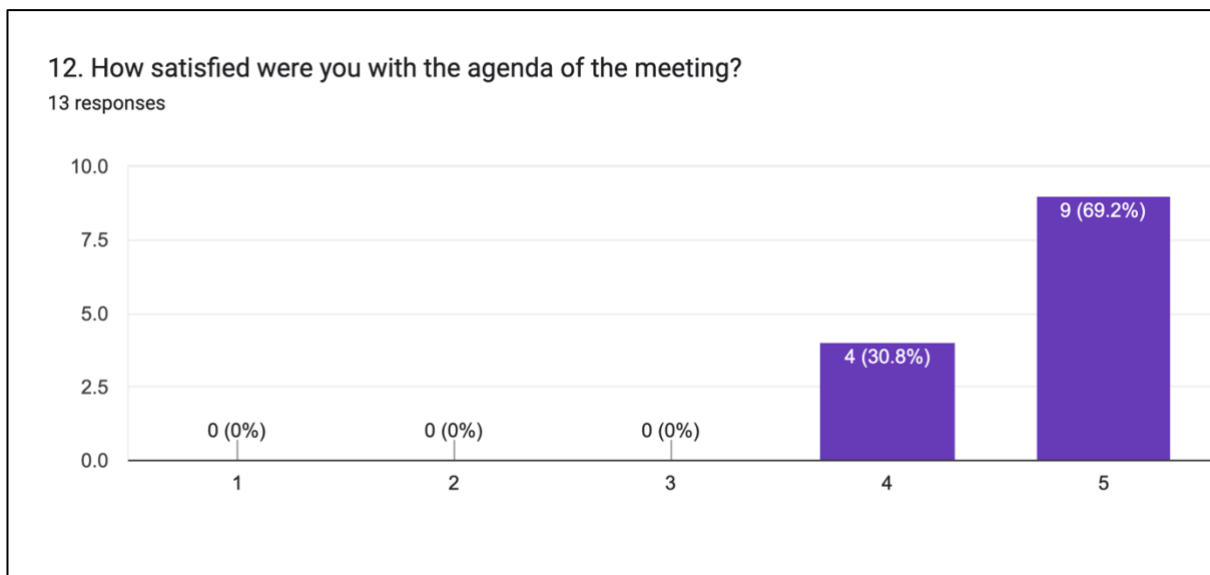
6. Lunches offered at the meeting – 4.54 / 5



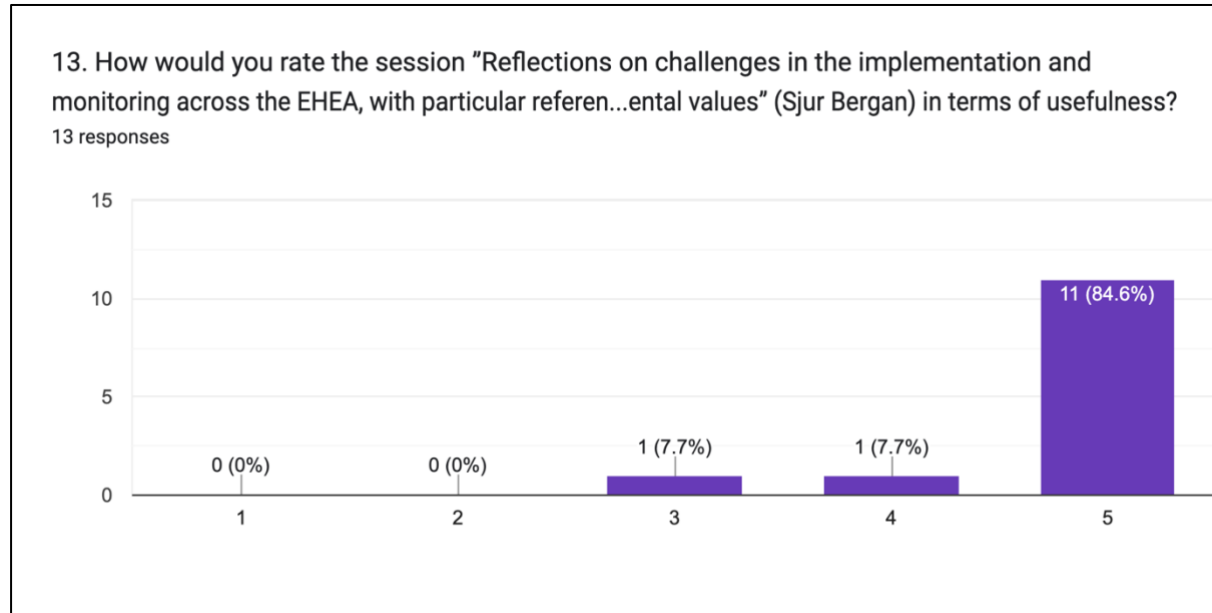
7. Informal dinner organized on 16th of June – 4.9 / 5



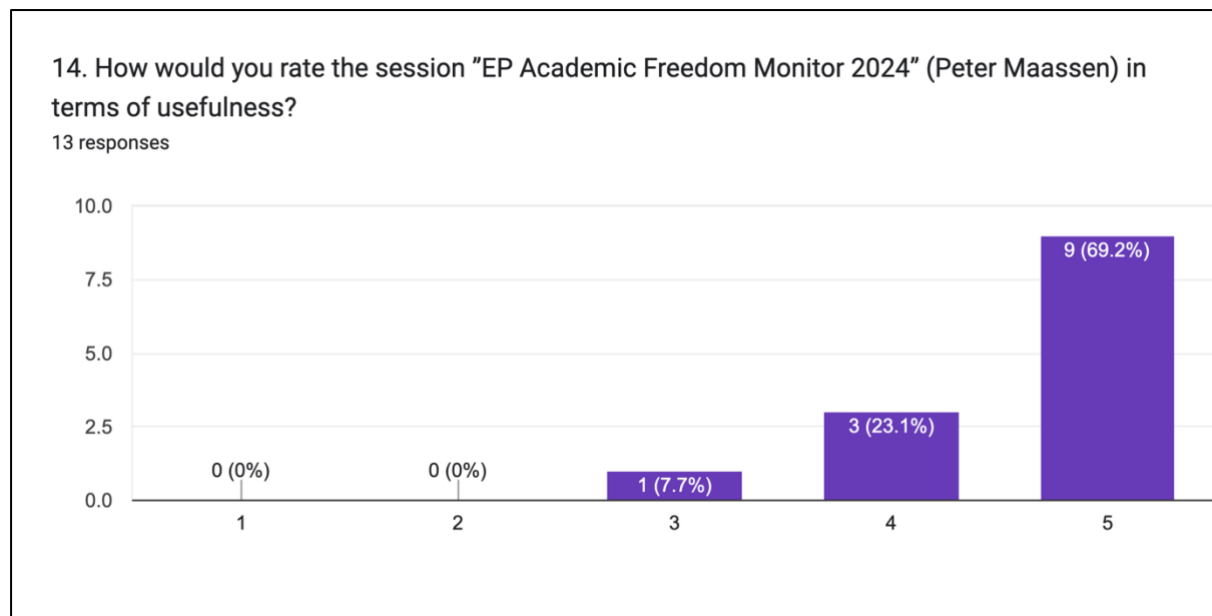
8. Agenda of the meeting – 4.69 / 5



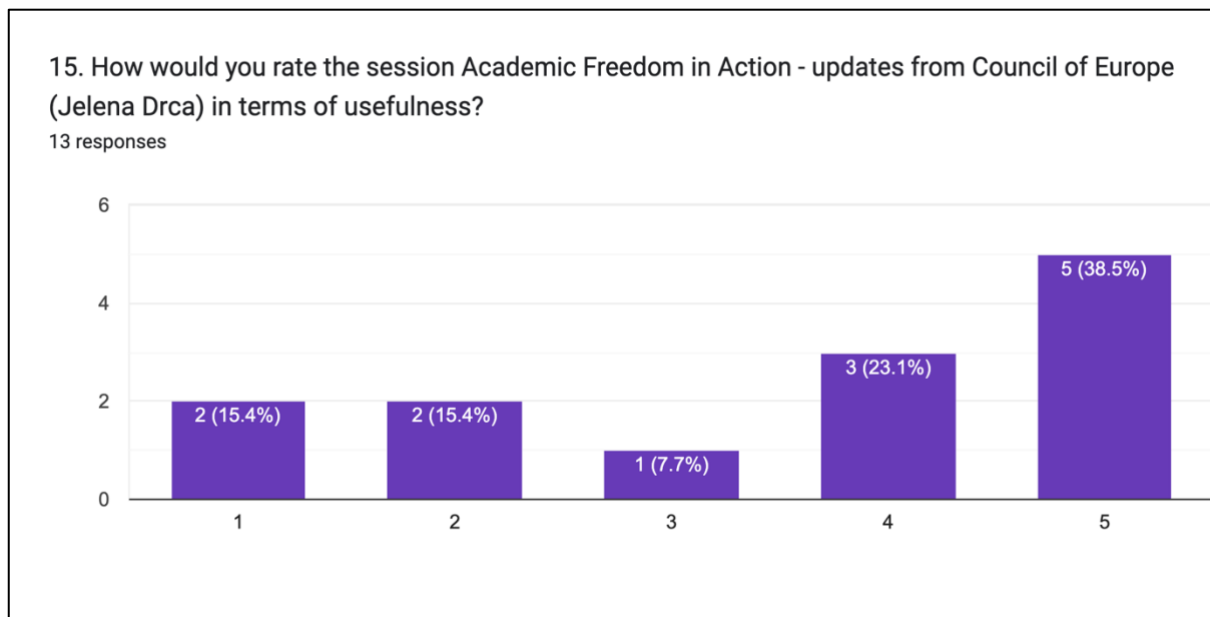

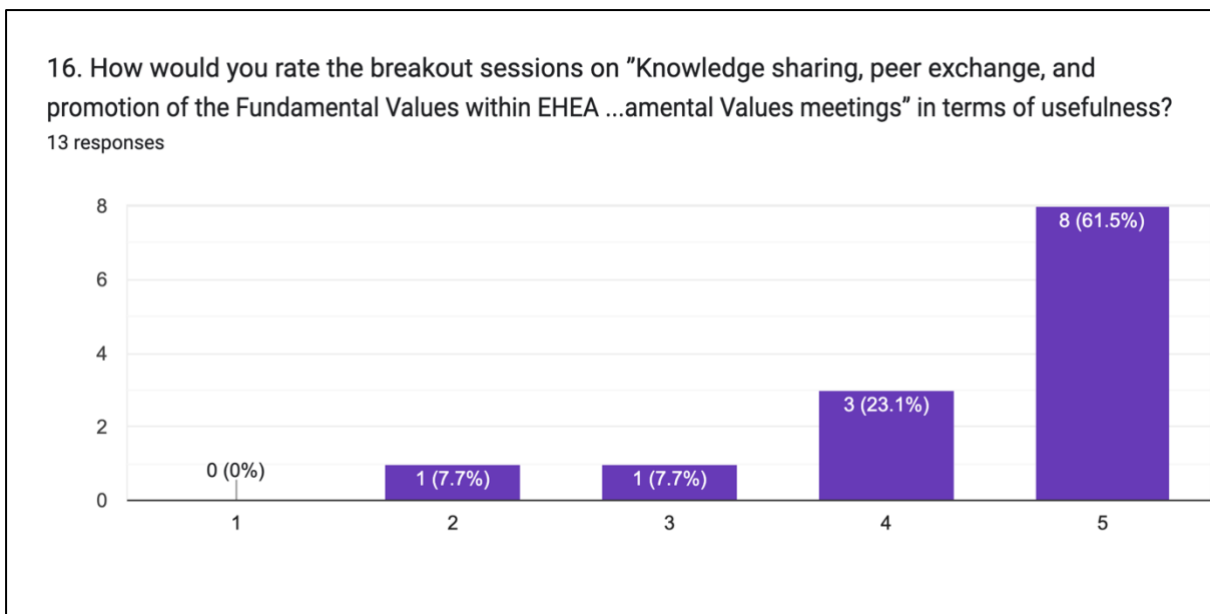
10. Session “EP Academic Freedom Monitor 2024” (usefulness) – 4.61 / 5



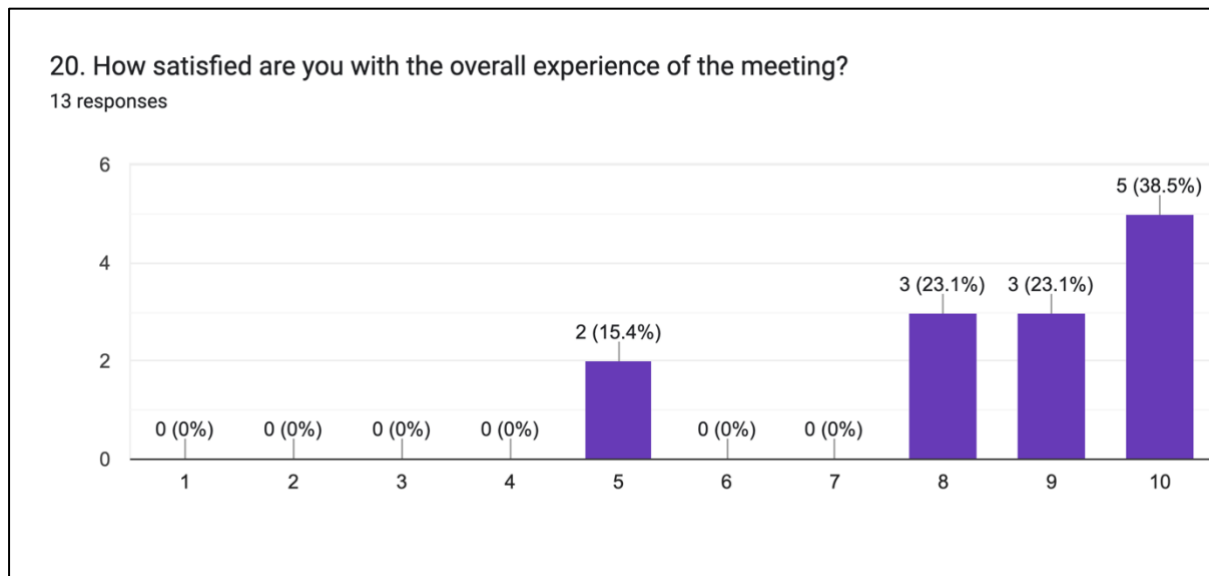

14. Other observations and suggestions for future meetings

- It was pointed out that the sound quality made it difficult for online participants to follow and interact, as the names and roles of speakers were not always clear.
- It was pointed out that presentations should remain focused on the topic under consideration rather than broad overviews of partners' activities.
- It was pointed out that some of the presentation slides used during the meeting differed from the versions shared beforehand, and it was suggested to provide the final slides well in advance.
- It was pointed out that discussions were sometimes dominated by a small group of experienced participants, and it was suggested that more inclusive facilitation could support the integration of new members.
- Several participants expressed sincere gratitude for the excellent organisation, valuable insights, and the Secretariat's contributions to the working process.
- It was suggested to explore the possibility of developing awareness-raising initiatives on fundamental values at national level, and to reflect jointly on these initiatives to identify common solutions.
- It was pointed out that sharing the official invitation and the detailed programme earlier would support participants - especially newcomers - in preparing adequately.
- It was suggested that future meetings should be scheduled further in advance.
- It was suggested to plan meetings in a way that avoids weekend travel.
