- Mobile staff members will be able to deepen their topics of interest through structured peer learning activity, to match their offers and needs.

Functioning

- Maximum 15 participants for 5 days each
- Every member of TPG B on LRC can apply to send 1 participant only. Additional members will be allowed to take part in the staff mobility activities on a self-paying basis.
- At the end of the period abroad, each mobile staff member will be asked to write a report.

Call for applications

- To express interest in the staff mobility, send an email answering 3 questions:
 1. Is your organisation willing to offer or to receive peer support?
 2. What is the specific thematic indication you are interested in (with an eventual reference to the National Action Plan) and why?
 3. Do you have a prior agreement with an institution to organise the staff mobility? → see *matchmaking activity*

Selection procedure

- A committee composed of the three TPG B Co-Chairs will review the applications and match the staff members on the basis of:
 - Thematic interest
 - Geographical spread
- Priority will be given to applications in which needs and offers of peer support are attuned to each other beforehand.
- Once selection results will be published, selected participants will sign a staff mobility acceptance letter.

Financing

- The financing of the mobility is limited to **maximum 5 days**.
- Total reimbursable amount for staff mobility (covering travel, accommodation and subsistence costs) will be calculated on the basis of **unit costs**, according to the EU funding rules, and must not exceed **1.500 € per selected participant**.

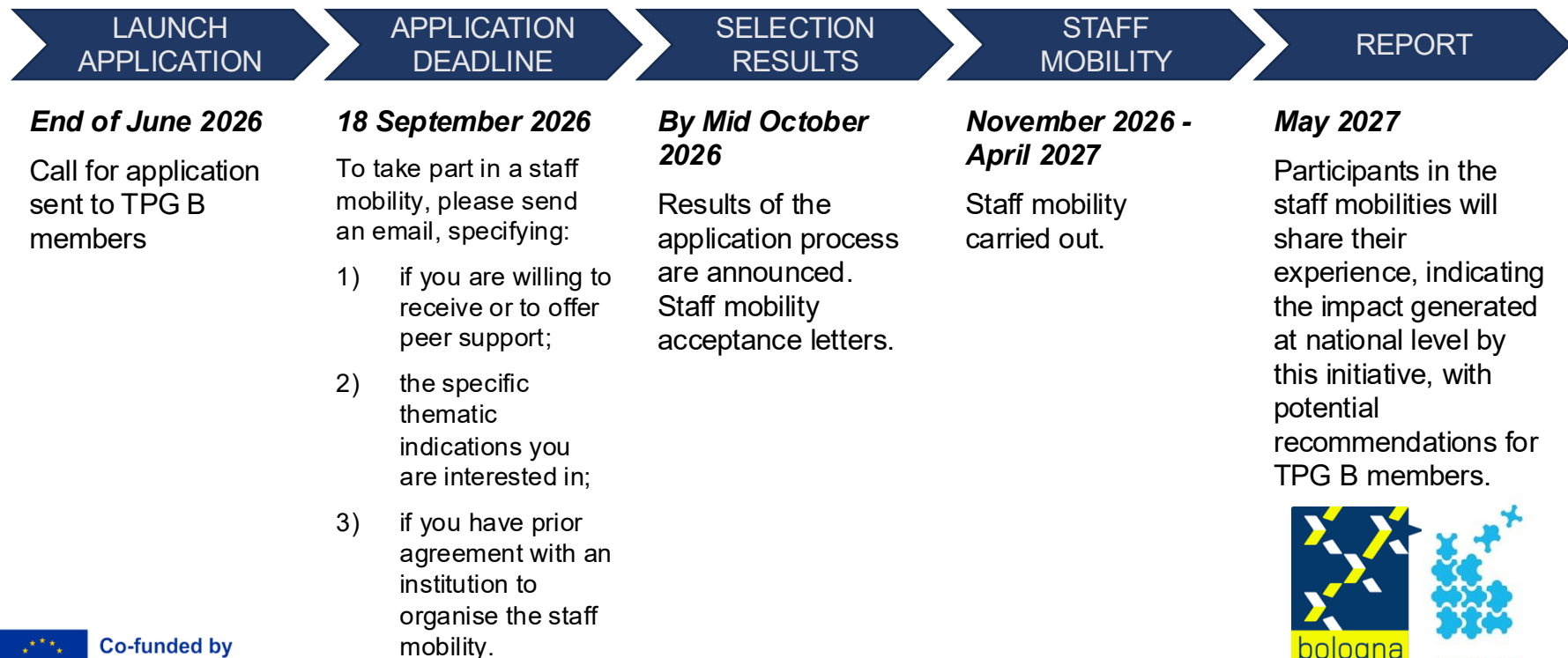

Timing



Matchmaking activity / 4th TPG B on LRC meeting

Each TPG B member participating in the meeting will engage in the matchmaking activity:

STEP 1. Offering / seeking support on specific thematic priorities [10 minutes]

- Up to 3 topics or subtopics linked to specific thematic priorities on which TPG B members **offer** support.
- Up to 3 topics or subtopics linked to specific thematic priorities on which TPG B members **seek** support.

STEP 2. Looking for the matching institution [30 minutes]

- Participants will move around in the 6 stations in the room.
- Participants will look for the institution they **can offer support to** or **receive support from**.

STEP 3. Book the flight! [10 minutes]

- Once the preliminary pairing has been identified, participants will fill their “boarding pass” in, specifying the period in why the activity could take place.

STEP 4. Outcomes of the matchmaking activity are presented in plenary [10 minutes]
